1 Format

We receive .pdf-files and convertible formats, but no .txt-files.

2 Article division

- **Headline**
The headline should illustrate the issue being presented.
- **Author(s) and contact**
Please mention the authors names and the email address of the first author after the headline.
- **Abstract**
It follows an abstract with the quitesence of the article.
- **Introduction**
The introduction should point out the basic information a reader needs to understand the articles content completely. This can by mathematical background (if nessecary) or details regarding the object.
- **Body of article**
The observation and the related results are presented here.
- **End**
Finally, a conclusion or outlook can be given.
- **Literature/sources**
If parts or information are taken from other sources, they have to quoted comprehensively and labeled. The sources are listed in the end of the article, not in footnotes.

3 Figures, tables and formulae

Figures always have to have a caption, so that the figure in combination with the caption is self-explanatory. In the case of tables, the author has to mention which data are compared. Formulae are to be embedded into the text, with explanation what the single variables stand for. Aside that, formulae are to be numbered consecutively. Any quantity is to be declared with units.
